Ordination Rites At Wanchai Church

Regional Seminary Graduates and Dominicans to be Ordained Priests by Bishop Bianchi

OMORROW, the first Saturday of July has been chosen by His Lordship Bishop Lawrence Bianchi for the ordination to the priesthood of eleven candidates from the Regional Seminary of Our Lady Queen of China in Aberdeen and six candidates from the Dominican Priory of St. Albert at Rosaryhill.

The ordination rite will be held at Holy Souls' Church, Wanchai and will begin at six o'clock in the afternoon in what will probably be the first ordinations at an evening Mass in the history of the Church in Hong Kong.

The ordinands are the Rev. Philip Chan, 32, and Rev. Joseph Tang, 28 from the Diocese of Hong Kong; the Rev. John Yan, 28. Rev. Joseph Lee, 27, 28, Rev. Following their ordinations the new priests will say their first Masses in various parish churches in Hong Kong.

Most of the new priests studied for seven to eight years at the Regional Seminary. Father Joseph Tang, former pupil of the Salesian school in Macao began his ecclesiastical studies at the Macao Seminary and before entering the Regional Seminary in Hong Kong was for two years Carmelite Noviciate in in the Goa.

Father Philip Chan also first entered the Macao Seminary where he studied for five years. During the war he had to interrupt his studies and for some six years he taught in different places in Kwangtung. After the war he was for a year in the Seminary of the Holy Ghost in Saikung and for the past seven years he studied at the Regional Seminary in Aberdeen. Father Chan is a gifted teacher-catechist.

Father Joseph Lee who will also work in Hong Kong has spent the past seven years at the Regional Seminary. He has two sisters who are nuns, one in the Providence Convent in the United States, the other with the Maryknoll Sisters in Kowloon.

Father John Yang, likewise assigned to work in Hong Kong, has spent eight years in the Regional Seminary.
