

Two Priests to be Ordained in H.K.

Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul

THE Rev. Joseph Wong Hak Piu, S.D.B. and the Rev. Francis Brian Elms will be ordained priests by Bishop Peter Lei of Hong Kong on the Feast of SS. Peter and Paul at the Immaculate Conception Cathedral, Hong Kong.

The rector and professors of Holy Spirit Seminary and the Salesian Provincial Superior and other Salesian priests will con-celebrate in the Ordination Mass.

During the ceremony a Salesian seminarian, Li Man Lit, will receive the diaconate.

The ceremony will start at 6 p.m.

Father Elms will celebrate his first Mass at Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church, Wanchai, at 6.30 p.m. on Sunday, June 30. Father Wong will celebrate his first Mass at Star of the Sea Church, Chai Wan, at 8.30 a.m. Sunday, June 30.

FRANCIS Brian Elms was born in Hong Kong on October 4th, 1938. He received his education in St. Francis Canossian School and St. Joseph College. After his graduation in 1958 he worked for nine years in a British commercial firm. In 1967 he entered the Holy Spirit Seminary. After three years study of philosophy and four years of theology he was ordained deacon in Macao on June 15 this year.

JOSEPH Wong Hak Piu was born in Shiuchow, Kwangtung province, in 1942. He came to Hong Kong in 1950 and entered the Salesian School in Shaukiwan. In 1952 he was baptised together with an elder brother though his family was still pagan. He was active in parish activities from the beginning. He was an altar boy and a member of the choir. He received his primary and secondary education from the Salesian Fa-

thers. In 1954 he entered the Dominic Savio Juniorate and in 1960 the Salesian Novitiate in Cheung Chau. After his philosophy he went to Jerusalem and studied theology in the Salesian Institute there for a year. In 1969 he returned to Hong Kong and continued his theology course in the Holy Spirit Seminary. In 1969 he received an external degree of B.A., majoring in English Literature, from London University. He was ordained deacon in 1973. Rev. Joseph Wong's ideal in life is to follow Christ closely, to serve and love the Church ardently, particularly in serving and loving the young.
